We have so many things to celebrate as we look back on 2019.

First, P.U.L.S.E. of Noble County, which stands for Philanthropists Utilizing Lifelong Services and Education, celebrated its 25th anniversary. Their mission is to broaden Noble County's horizons of education and service through philanthropy. This group of service-minded youth meet monthly to organize community projects that benefit Noble County and grant philanthropic dollars to organizations making an impact. Under the direction of our Program Director, Margarita White, this group is a shining star in our community. Through their involvement, youth pod members increase their leadership skills, build an appreciation for their community and develop a strong base in philanthropy and community service. Over its 25 year history, P.U.L.S.E. has had 108 youth pod members, 25 adult navigators, and distributed over 600 grants and scholarships totaling over \$325,000!

We also celebrate the work that has taken place with the support of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT VII program. Community foundations across Indiana are so fortunate to have the support of Lilly. GIFT stands for Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow. The focus of GIFT VII was to support community foundations as they work to transition to a role of leadership in their community. Throughout 2019, CFNC hosted focus groups, conducted stakeholder interviews and surveyed the community to better understand the needs and gaps in our community along with how folks currently viewed the foundation's role. The feedback gathered from these activities along with the strategic planning work of our board of directors is shaping the foundation's role in the community for 2020 and beyond.

Lastly, we want to celebrate YOU! CFNC is so fortunate to have the amazing support of this community. Your gifts of time, talent, and treasure strengthens our foundation and makes Noble County a great place to live, work and play.

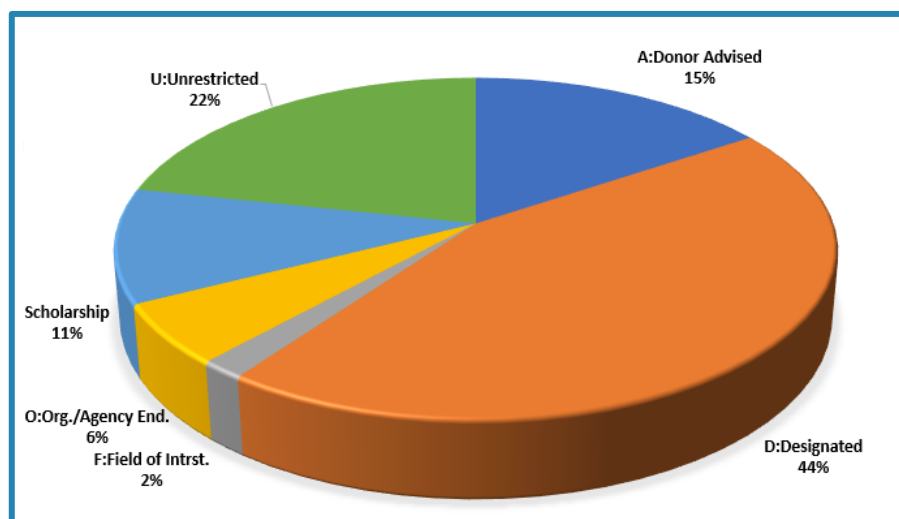

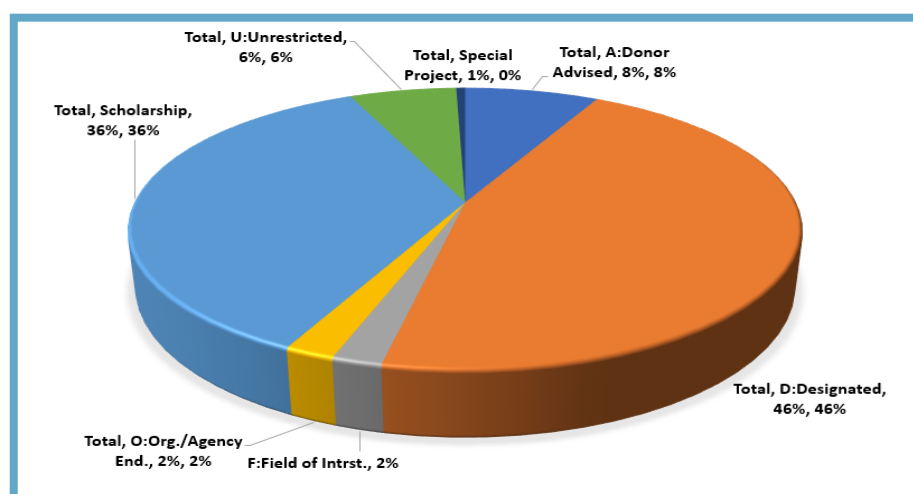

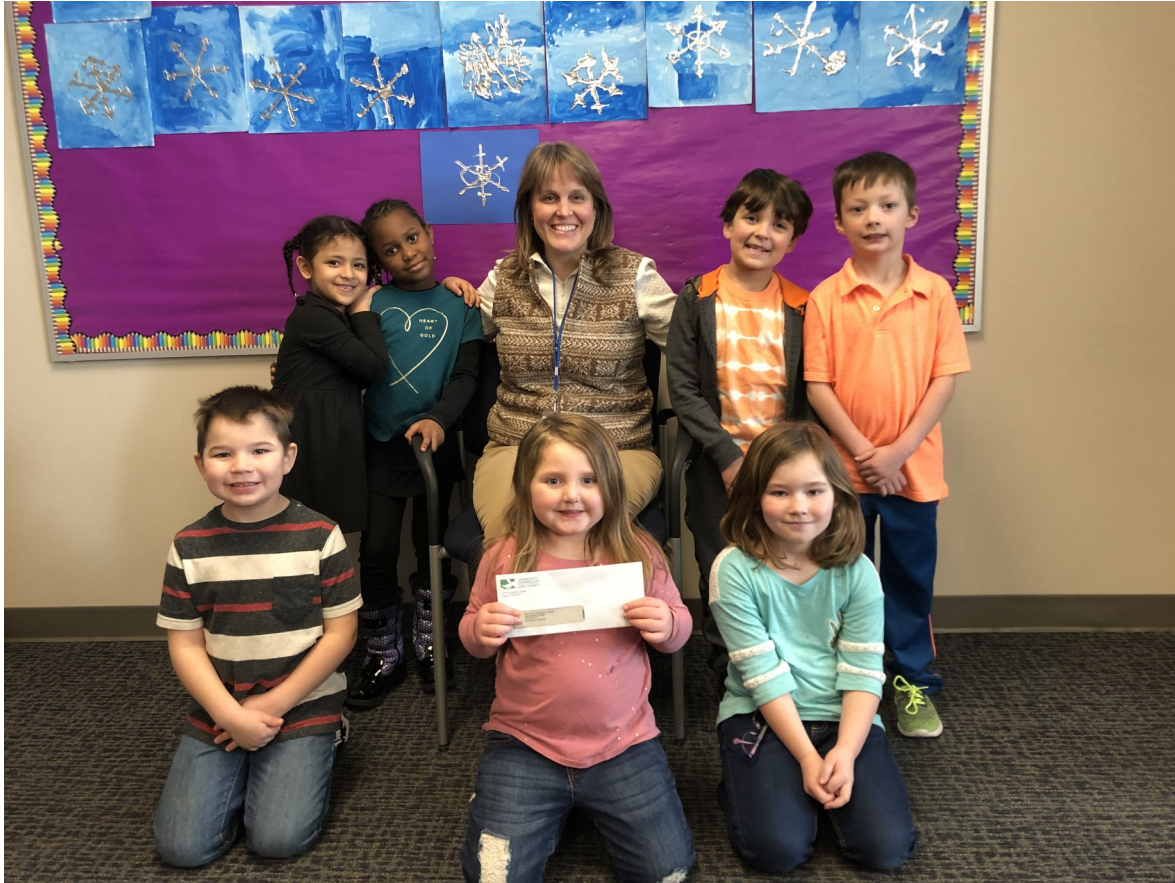

Youth Philanthropy

The group carefully considers grant proposals from area nonprofits, awarding funding to projects that align with their mission. The group can also be found doing monthly service projects across the county, and partnering with nonprofit organizations to make a positive impact in our community.



Welcome New Funds

Community Learning Center Fund



Founded in 2019, the Community Learning Center in Kendallville strives to advance the self-sufficiency of all residents through collaborative, multi generational programs and offerings. The vision for the community learning center is to maximize the potential and self-sufficiency of residents of all ages through collaborative, multi-generational programs. The programs will assist residents of Kendallville and throughout Noble County in building skills, furthering their knowledge, improving their health and more.

St. Martin's Healthcare, Inc. Fund

St. Martin's Healthcare, Inc. provides quality medical and dental care for acute and chronic conditions, optometry and medication assistance services to uninsured and underinsured residents in DeKalb and Noble counties. We hope to help them achieve their philanthropic goal!



Kendallville Redevelopment Commission Agency Fund

The Kendallville Redevelopment Commission Fund was established in 2019 to provide support to the City of Kendallville via the Redevelopment Commission. This includes projects that will enhance and revitalize the downtown area, such as streetscapes, façade upgrades and infrastructure improvements.

Churubusco Football Fund

The Churubusco Football Fund is a designated, non-permanent fund that will support the work of the football program at Smith-Green Community Schools. BY partnering with the Community Foundation of Noble County, this athletic program can better support their student athletes and community!





Dr. Terry Gaff Legacy Fund for Noble Trails

Noble Trails Inc. is dedicated to creating and maintaining pedestrian and bicycle trails in Noble County to encourage activity and improve the health and well-being of all who travel on the trails. This fund was established in July 2019, in an effort to make sure that the trails will be sustained and maintained for future generations. It was created by the family of Dr. Terry Gaff who served as board president of Noble Trails Inc. in honor of his retirement from seeing patients after more than 40 years of medical practice.

Chuck Schlemmer Memorial Scholarship Fund

Chuck Schlemmer loved Social Studies and he loved teaching it. He taught at West Noble High School for 27 ½ years. He inspired students with his love of history and with his genuine concern and respect for the kids in his classroom. Chuck's interests were diverse. He ran the distance of the earth's circumference more than once, keeping a detailed running log the nearly 50 years he ran. He read as relentlessly as he ran – classics, non-fiction and anything he thought would broaden his understanding. He loved to fish, to hike, to canoe and camp. He noticed natural beauty better than anyone. He enjoyed going to antique auctions and about any kind of sporting event. He also loved to travel to beautiful and historic places with Muir Woods, U.S. National Parks, and Tikal, Guatemala among his favorites. Chuck was well-loved and he loved deeply. Due to the generosity of many people his family was able to offer this scholarship in his name to honor both his memory and students to whom this scholarship is awarded.



Kendallville Revitalization Agency Fund

The Kendallville Revitalization Agency Fund was established in April of 2019 to support the revitalization and re-development projects in Kendallville's downtown Main Street corridor. Funds may be used for projects that build infrastructure , promote beautification and downtown appeal, or other projects that advance commerce and economic development in the downtown district.

Susan A. Price Memorial Scholarship Fund

Susan A. Price was an ambitious, independent, curious, and adventurous woman. She was also a hard-nosed business person who knew how to build and maintain good working relationships. She was a warm, friendly, compassionate, and empathetic person. All of this made her a terrific wife, mother, and friend in addition to being a successful businesswoman. Susan was born in Frankfurt Germany, in 1952, while her father was stationed there. Her family returned to the US and she was raised in Wawaka. She attended Wawaka High School until it was merged into West Noble High School where she graduated in 1969. Susan's parents, Joseph Price and Bonnie Jean Yant, and her sister, Shirley, also attended Wawaka High School. Susan went on to earn a BA in English from Indiana University in 1973. She moved to Gary upon graduation to work at IU Northwest, then to the DePaul neighborhood in Chicago when she started working in Human Resources at Illinois Central Community Hospital. While there she negotiated union contracts, attended night school at Loyola University, earning an MS in Industrial Relations, and began investing in rental property. She spent a couple of years as Office Administrator for an IT consulting firm before joining Yearbook Medical Publishing as HR Director. As part of the merger and acquisitions team, she helped quadruple the size of the company with operations in the US and Europe. She rose to become VP, Administration and International HR. After leaving professional employment, Susan applied herself to multiple property restoration and management projects. Susan was an incredible woman. To honor her memory, this fund was established for students with similar aptitudes.



Kendallville Restoration, Inc. Fund



Kendallville Restorations, Inc. is a volunteer group made up of community members with a clear vision of eliminating blight, stabilizing neighborhoods, and restoring homes for single family living. The organization's work is not tax supported; instead, it relies on volunteer labor and community donations to collect the funds necessary for the services that need to be contracted out. This fund was established to collect donations to help this organization achieve its goal!

Edward and Beverly Zimmerman Memorial Scholarship Fund

Edward served in the Marines and used the GI Bill to graduate from Iowa State with a degree in agriculture economics. Beverly spent many hours volunteering and was named Ligonier Citizen of the Year in 1985. She served on the Board of Directors for the Ruth Stultz Nursery School and Lighthouse Ministries in Ligonier, and was a member of the Beta Sigma Phi Sorority and the Ligonier Study club.

Ed and Bev were avid supporters of West Noble High School, where their four children participated in athletics, cheerleading, drama, and extracurricular clubs. This scholarship was established to celebrate students with similar interests as the Zimmerman family.
